LETTER OF REPRESENTATION

Dear Claims Department:

1. Name of the insurer(s);
2. Name of each insured;
3. Copy of limits of liability coverage:
 - a. for personal injury;
 - b. property damage;
 - c. medical expense;

Please note that in *Bicourt v. Amex Ins. Co.* (2000) 78 Cal.App.4th 1390, 1392, the Court of Appeal held that it can be bad faith to not seek out the insured's consent to disclose the limit since a failure to do so inhibits the chances of the case settling within the policy limit. Please notify us whether or not your insured has decided to allow disclosure of the policy limit.

When we complete our full investigation and when our client's medical condition and future prognosis is better known and stabilized, we will complete our preliminary assessment of the case. At that time, we intend to send you, or the appropriate representative from your insurance company, a settlement proposal in an effort to expeditiously resolve this claim in a manner that is fair to all parties and saves all concerned parties time and future legal expenses.
